- Patch Development Update
  - o S. Watson summarized the Town Council meeting.
    - Approved the Carve out of the TIF area.
    - Approved Tax Abatement request for the first building.
    - Distributed maps showing the area.
    - There will be a September public hearing to finalize the process.
  - Andrew Greenwood, representative of the Patch Development out lined the following information:
    - Project started in December of 2021 with the rezoning of the Horsely property.
    - It is now called the "Gateway to Whiteland".
    - There will be retail, industrial, commercial, and multi-family units.

- There will also be help with a drainage issue across the street.
- There will be a private partnership with the Town for the first two buildings (phase 1) to help with the infrastructure and roadways.
- All information was fact checked by Stone Municipal Group, Stephen Watson- attorney.
- Develop Backed Bonds will be issued for approximately \$8,000,000 on the first two buildings.
- No abatement on the retail on the commercial or frontage commercial properties.
- Over 90 million dollars in assessed value.
- The Public Safety Building will have space to be built.
- o S. Watson stated the meeting tonight was informational. There will be no decisions made.
  - RDC would agree to pay with the TIF funds coming from the project from the carve out only. If there were not enough revenues to pay, then the Developer would take care of the rest. It would not affect the other 88% of the Town's TIF area. The project is only 12% of the entire TIF area.
