RESOLUTION NO. 2022-12

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A WHITELAND CUMULATIVE BUILDING AND EQUIPMENT FUND (FIRE) PURSUANT TO IND. CODE 6-1.1-41 AND IND. CODE 36-8-14, AND REPLACING COUNCIL RESOLUTION 2022-11

WHEREAS, Ind. Code § 6-1.1-41 permits the legislative body of a municipality to establish a Cumulative Building or Remodeling, Firefighting, and Police Radio Equipment Fund (“Cumulative Fund”);

WHEREAS, the Town Council (the “Council”) of the Town of Whiteland believes that such a Cumulative Fund is necessary and prudent for the financial well-being of the municipality, the fire protection service area of the Town of Whiteland Fire Department (formerly the Whiteland Fire Protection District service territory), and that a need exists for the establishment of a Cumulative Fund for the purposes permitted in Ind. Code § 36-8-14-2;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ind. Code § 36-8-14, the proposed rate for the Cumulative Fund will not exceed \$0.0333 on each \$100 of assessed valuation and said tax rate will be levied beginning with taxes for 2022 payable 2023;

WHEREAS, the Cumulative Fund is intended to replace the previously existing Special Cum Fire Fund (Fund 8691) established by the Whiteland Fire Protection District; and

WHEREAS, the Council has provided notice of its intent to establish the Cumulative Fund to affected taxpayers and has held a public hearing on the proposal pursuant to Ind. Code §§ 6-1.1-41-3 and 5-3-1.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF WHITELAND, INDIANA, THAT:

Section 1. There is hereby established a Cumulative Building or Remodeling, Firefighting, and Police Radio Equipment Fund for the Town of Whiteland, Indiana.

Section 2. An ad valorem property tax levy will be imposed and the revenues from the levy will be retained in the Cumulative Fund.

Section 3. This Council will adhere to the provisions of Ind. Code §§ 6-1.1-41-1 *et. seq.* and 36-8-14-1 *et. seq.* The proposed fund levy will not exceed \$0.0333 on each \$100 of assessed valuation for 2022 Payable 2023. Said tax rate will be levied beginning with taxes for 2022 payable 2023.

Section 4. The funds accumulated in the Cumulative Fund shall be used for all uses as set out in Ind. Code § 36-8-14-2.

Section 5. The Cumulative Fund is intended to replace the previously existing Special Cum Fire Fund (Fund 8691) and associated tax levy established by the Whiteland Fire Protection District, and a tax levy for the Special Cum Fire Fund shall no longer be imposed.


Section 6. Proof of publication of the notice of public hearing held on the 10th day of May, 2022, and a certified copy of this resolution shall be submitted to the Department of Local Government Finance of the State of Indiana as provided by law. This Cumulative Fund is subject to the approval of the Department of Local Government Finance. The Town Manager, or his designee, is hereby authorized, empowered, and directed, on behalf of the Town, to publish notice of adoption of this Resolution and to take any other action deemed necessary or desirable to effectuate this Resolution, including to submit to the Indiana Department of Local Government Finance proof of publication of the notice of the public hearing and notice of adoption by May 31, 2022. A Certificate of No Remonstrance from the County Auditor shall also be filed with the Indiana Department of Local Government Finance as soon after the end of the remonstrance period as possible.

Section 7. Resolution 2022-11 is hereby repealed and replaced by this Resolution.

Section 8. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.




