# Ordinance 2023-10, Approving EDC Bond for Phase II of Patch Project

- S. Watson summarized the project and stated it was originally introduced in July. He recommends the Town moves forward with Phase II after approval from the EDC Board.
- Andrew Greenwood, Patch Development, the primary benefit of doing the project in this structure in one swoop. There will also be infrastructure improvements. Bond closing should be sometime in October.
