

**WHITELAND TOWN COUNCIL  
ORDINANCE NO. 2024-11**

**AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING A POLICY CONCERNING COORDINATION  
ON DISPOSAL OF PERSONAL PROPERTY OF THE TOWN**

WHEREAS, the Whiteland Town Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the Town to adopt a policy concerning the coordination of the disposal of personal property of the Town of Whiteland.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of the Town of Whiteland, Indiana, as follows:

**Section 1.** Section 38.40 of the Whiteland Town Code is hereby added to read as follows:

**§ 38.40 COORDINATION ON DISPOSAL OF PERSONAL PROPERTY OF THE TOWN.**

(A) Absent an exception expressly granted by the Town Council, personal property of the Town with an estimated value of \$2,500 or more shall not be transferred, sent to auction, or otherwise disposed of to a third party or otherwise (collectively, "Disposal"), without all of the following occurring first:

- 1) At least one (1) independent written quote of the value of the property shall be obtained, which may be trade-in value, auction value, or some other reasonably reliable independent valuation of the property.
- 2) The property shall be offered to the other Town departments, via written correspondence to each Town department head and the Town Manager or Director of Administration. If the property is to be transferred to another department of the Town, an amount equal to the value of property shall be transferred from the appropriated budget of the department receiving the property to the appropriated budget of the department relinquishing the property, unless otherwise determined by the Town Council. And,

(B) All disposal of Town property must be approved by the Town Council.

(C) All Disposal of personal property of the Town shall also comply with the requirements of IC 5-22-22-1 *et. seq.* to the extent applicable, and all other applicable laws.

**Section 2.** The provisions of all other ordinances, resolutions, or the Whiteland Town Code provisions in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are of no further force or effect.

**Section 3.** If any part of this ordinance is held to be invalid, such part will be deemed severable and its validity shall have no effect upon the remaining provisions of this ordinance.


**Section 4.** The provisions set forth in this ordinance shall become and remain in full force and effect (until their repeal by ordinance) on the date of adoption of this ordinance as evidenced by the signature of the executive as prescribed by Indiana Code 36-5-2-10, subject to publication of this ordinance to the extent required by law.
